

# Welcome to the Quarantine Island Treasure Hunt

The treasure hunt will take you around the Island.  
Collect the clues at each stop, while learning about the  
history of each place!

The first clue:

- It is triangular in shape, with a view of the harbour down to Aramoana through a tall narrow window.
- Bob Oakley was the architect. His design was influenced by where it is built. What do you think could have influenced him?
- It was gradually built from the 1960s, the walls from rammed earth. Can you imagine what might have been hard about building it?



## Quarantine Island Treasure Hunt



- This is the only quarantine building that remains standing on the island. It was built in 1873 and is famous in Otago and nationally.
- Its restoration has been a major project. Look at this photo and others to see how it has changed over time.
- Look at the photos and plans inside to see what other buildings were part of the quarantine complex. Are there any signs of where these buildings were now?

- At the top of a little slope, looking out towards Portobello and back towards the city, stands a brick double chimney, all that is left from another of the important buildings during the quarantine period. Go there.
- This building was built in 1873, and there are pegs outlining its shape. What was it?

## Quarantine Island Treasure Hunt



- This place is on the south side of the island. It contains about 72 unmarked graves of the early immigrants.
- Who is the headstone for? Can you make out the inscription?
- There is also a memorial to the Rev. Dave Wilson, the Community's first resident Keeper, who lived and worked on the Island for 10 years.

Head to the old Keepers Cottage- now 'St Martin Lodge', added to 90 years ago with stained glass windows and porches.
